**FIFTH-ANNUAL GEORGETOWN JINGLE ANNOUNCES PARTICIPATING DESIGNERS
 Top Regional Interior Designers Donate Creative Talents to Holiday Event Benefiting
 Lombardi Comprehensive Cancer Center's Pediatric Programs**

WASHINGTON, DC (May 26, 2010) – Twelve acclaimed interior designers will participate in the fifth-annual Georgetown Jingle at Four Seasons Hotel Washington, DC, on Sunday, December 12, 2010. The family-friendly holiday extravaganza, hosted each year by Four Seasons Hotel, JDS Designs, and The Washington Design Center, benefits Georgetown University Hospital's pediatric oncology programs. A design team from Martha Stewart Living Omnimedia, Inc., will take part in the event this year for the first time.

The participating designers transform Four Seasons Hotel Washington into a winter wonderland with original, festively themed tree and vignette creations. "“Designers pour their hearts and souls into the Jingle creations,” says Georgetown Jingle Design Chair Frank Randolph of Frank Babb Randolph Interior Design. “Their ingenuity is matched only by their generosity. The Georgetown Jingle captures the true spirit of giving and we in the design community are delighted to do our part for Georgetown pediatric patients and their families.”

The trees and vignettes will be on display at the Four Seasons Hotel on December 1, 2010. The trees at Banana Republic Georgetown and The Washington Design Center will be on display in early November. With the exception of the Banana Republic tree, which will be raffled, all trees and vignettes will be

available for the “buy it now” price on December 1. Georgetown Jingle attendees can bid on the remaining inspired holiday décor during a silent auction, which also will include getaway packages, spa treatments, sports tickets, children’s gifts, among other sought-after items. A raffle will offer the chance to win fabulous prizes, including a 2011 Venza donated by DARCARS/Toyota. The event’s other features include culinary samplings from top area restaurants, holiday music, live entertainment, and a CVS/pharmacy Workshop where children decorate cookies, create festive cards, enjoy kid-friendly food and meet Santa.

Proceeds from the Georgetown Jingle benefit the Pediatric Bone Marrow Transplant Program (in collaboration with Duke University) and the Childhood Cancer Survivorship Program at Georgetown University Hospital. The programs are directed by Dr. Aziza Shad, one of the region’s most respected oncologists. Over the past five years, the Georgetown Jingle has raised \$1.3 million for these pediatric programs.

The Georgetown Jingle will be held at Four Seasons Hotel Washington, DC, on Sunday, December 12, from 5 to 8 pm. Tickets are \$150 per person, \$350 for families of four, \$50 for kids 3-18, and free for children under 2. For more information about the event, visit www.georgetownjingle.com.
